INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

USAID's Property Rights Program (PRP) is a four-year activity that aims to address the property rights challenges and to develop a plan for the stabilization of the property rights regime in Kosovo. The program will work in partnership with the Government of Kosovo (GOK), selected municipalities and other relevant local and international stakeholders. USAID has allocated \$8.5 million for the implementation of the Property Rights Program.

The PRP supports the following objectives:

- Objective 1: Better Coordination and Policy Priorities,
- Objective 2: Improved Court Procedures Related to Property Claims,
- Objective 3: Enhance Women's Rights to Use Property in Practice,
- Objective 4: Improved Communication, Access to Information and Understanding of Property Rights.

The PRP will support the Ministry of Justice (MOJ) to own and direct the property reform process and coordinate the European Commission Office in Kosovo (ECO/Kosovo) and other donors' support to the MOJ with technical inputs from line ministries and agencies to rationalize reform efforts and maximize development impacts. PRP has a mandate to improve court procedures related to property claims, with emphasis on improving court practices to remove constraints to women inheriting property in practice. The PRP's activities with the courts will inform EU assistance to the MOJ to draft implementation oriented property legislation. PRP results under Objectives 1 and 2 support improved legal regimes and stronger implementation and improved court performance that contributes to achieving USAID/Kosovo's Country Development Cooperation Strategy Development (CDCS) Objective 1 "Improved Rule of Law and Governance that Meets Citizens' Needs." Improved legislation and court procedures also support creation of an Improved Economic Governance and Business Environment under the CDCS Development Objective 2 "Increased Investment and Private Sector Employment."

The PRP supports USAID Forward implementation and Local Solutions by building sustainable organizational and technical capacity of Kosovo Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and municipal governments to manage and administer USAID direct awards through grants and Government to Government (G2G) agreements under Objectives 3 and 4, respectively. Under Objective 3, CSOs will develop and implement public information and advocacy campaigns to inform women and men about women's rights to property and change attitudes and behaviors about women's rights to inherit property. Under Objective 4, municipal capacity will be built to improve delivery of property related services enabling citizens to more efficiently transact their rights to property.

1.0 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 SUMMARY OF RESULTS FOR THE REPORTING PERIOD AND KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

1.1.1 OBJECTIVE 1: BETTER COORDINATION AND POLICY PRIORITIES

To support development of a National Strategy for Property Rights under Objective 1, PRP provided assistance to the Ministry of Justice (MOJ) to prepare the technical documentation required under the applicable legislation to request a decision from the Government of Kosovo (GOK) authorizing the MOJ to draft the National Strategy for inclusion in the GOK's Strategic Plan for 2015. In parallel, PRP worked with the MOJ, the Department for European Integration and Policy Coordination of the MOJ, the EU Support to the Civil Code and Property Rights Project (CCPR) and USAID to establish the modalities for the Property Rights Sector Working Group SWG), through which the National Strategy will be developed and presented to the GOK. The MOJ submitted the request to the Prime Minister's Strategic Planning Office on March 10, 2015 and approval is pending.

PRP is also working with the MOJ and CCPR to assess property classifications prescribed under the laws of the former Yugoslavia to be updated consistent with the requirements of a land market to support Kosovo's economic development. The issues of restitution, both pre and post-conflict, and challenges regarding resolution of the clams related socially-owned enterprises (SOEs) also constrain development of a robust land market. These are significant issues will be addressed by the SWG through the National Strategy.

Upon request of the Adviser of the Prime Minister without Portfolio, PRP provided assistance to implement a technical agreement between the Republic of Kosovo and the Republic of Serbia related to the return of cadastral documents removed by the Serbian regime during the conflict and finalization of a draft Law on the Kosovo Property Comparison and Verification Agency (KPCVA) to resolve discrepancies between the returned documents and documents currently maintained in Kosovo's Municipal Cadastral Offices. A working group has been established consisting of the Director of the Legal Office of the Prime Minister's Office, the Kosovo Cadastre Agency (KCA), the Kosovo Property Agency (KPA), a member of the US Embassy, and the European Special Representative to develop the final draft of the legislation. The Office of the Prime Minister has requested PRP to assistance to prepare by-laws to implement the new law as it expects it will be passed in the next two months.

1.1.2 OBJECTIVE 2: IMPROVED COURT PROCEDURES RELATED TO PROPERTY CLAIMS

PRP facilitated a participatory process with the Kosovo Judicial Council (KJC) to select four Courts of Merit that will work with the PRP to develop, pilot and test court procedures to more efficiently adjudicate property claims and disputes and ensure women's rights to inherit property are fully enforced. In consultation with the KJC, the presiding judges of the seven basic courts, the presiding judge of the court of appeals, the Basic Courts of Peja, Gjilan, and Ferizaj with the Branch in Sterpce were selected as the Courts of Merits. The President of the Court of Appeals and Court Presidents highly recommended establishment of an Advisory Committee comprised of thought leaders and agents of change in the court system to assist the KJC and PRP develop procedures and processes to increase court efficiency. It is expected the Advisory Committee will be fully functional in the next quarter.

1.1.3 OBJECTIVE 3: ENHANCE WOMEN'S RIGHTS TO USE PROPERTY IN PRACTICE

In February 2015 the Tetra Tech ARD Director of Grants Management and PRP Grants and Subcontracts Manager assessed capacity of USAID's Engagement for Equity (E4E) implementing partner, Advocacy Training & Resources Center (ATRC), and provided support to ATRC to begin the process of issuing and administering grants under the E4E program. ATRC was provided training on USAID grant making procedures, systems, and planning processes throughout the entire grants cycle. Additionally, ATRC was provided assistance to develop RFA topics that will assist PRP achieve its program objectives related to public education, outreach, and advocacy activities to improve women's access to property rights in practice.

PRP continued to work with key stakeholders to refine its Behavior Change Communications (BCC) strategy and messaging that will serve as a key component in the information and outreach program that the PRP will support ATRC to implement through grants to CSOs under the E4E program. PRP facilitated participatory workshops on January 28 and March 30, 2015 to further develop BCC content and messaging. Another key outcome from the workshops was the formation of a Property Rights Communications Working Group to coordinate information and outreach activities promoting women's property rights that are currently being implemented by government agencies and donor funded projects.

The Minister of Justice expressed support for the recommendations presented in the Gender Report Dr. Sandra Joireman prepared for PRP during the last quarter. He requested PRP to facilitate an event jointly with the MOJ to present the ministry's support for reform based on the report's recommendations to strengthen the property rights of women. The event is scheduled for April 22, 2015. The Minister has created a working group, on which PRP specialists will serve, to recommend amendments to legislation as part of the Ministry's reform efforts. PRP also worked with CCPR project experts to review legislation and practice regarding family and inheritance law and produce a draft an analysis of these laws.

PRP has secured places on both the Inheritance and Family Law working group established by the CCPR project and the working group established by the MOJ to amend the Inheritance Law. It is expected the two working groups will begin drafting activities in the next quarter.

PRP provided technical assistance and inputs to the Agency for Gender Equality (AGE) to develop an Administrative Instruction (AI) for Registration of Common Property. A draft AI was produced and PRP will support public consultation in the next quarter. PRP also provided technical input to CCPR's analysis of the Inheritance Law.

1.1.4 OBJECTIVE 4: IMPROVED COMMUNICATION, ACCESS TO INFORMATION AND UNDERSTANDING OF PROPERTY RIGHTS

PRP developed and submitted to USAID a substantially revised proposal for activities to be implemented by municipalities with direct assistance from USAID to improve the sharing of land-related information to assist courts to more efficiently resolve property claims and to facilitate market transactions. USAID will provide comment and feedback to further develop the proposal in the next quarter. Key priorities for the next quarter are to advance development of the National Strategy for Property Rights; develop and implement reform activities through the Courts of Merit; assist ATRC to implement E4E activities in support of PRP efforts to change attitudes and behaviors about women's rights to property and assist the MOJ to develop legislation to strengthen the property rights of women; and work with USAID to further develop the proposal for direct funding to municipalities to improve the sharing of land-related information to assist courts to more efficiently resolve property claims and to facilitate market transactions.

2.0 PROJECT ACTIVITIES

2.1 OBJECTIVE 1: BETTER COORDINATION AND POLICY PRIORITIES

2.1.1 SUPPORT DEVELOPMENT OF THE NATIONAL STRATEGY FOR PROPERTY RIGHTS

In collaboration with the Ministry of Justice (MOJ), the Director of the Department for European Integration and Policy Coordination of the MOJ, the EU Support to the Civil Code and Property Rights Project (CCPR) and USAID, PRP facilitated development of the modalities for the Property Rights Sector Working Group (SWG), through which the National Strategy for Property Rights will be developed and presented to the GOK.

PRP provided assistance to the MOJ to prepare the technical documentation required under the applicable legislation to request a decision from the Government of Kosovo (GOK) authorizing the MOJ to draft the National Strategy for inclusion in the GOK's Strategic Plan for 2015. The MOJ submitted the request to the Prime Minister's Strategic Planning Office on March 10, 2015 and approval is pending.

Additionally, PRP began work with the MOJ and CCPR to assess property classifications prescribed under the laws of the former Yugoslavia to be updated consistent with the requirements of a land market to support Kosovo's economic development. The issues of restitution, both pre and post-conflict, and challenges regarding resolution of the clams related socially-owned enterprises (SOEs) also constrain development of a robust land market. These are significant issues will be addressed by the SWG through the National Strategy.

2.1.2 SUPPORT DEVELOPMENT OF PROPERTY RIGHTS LEGISLATION

Upon request of the Adviser of the Prime Minister without Portfolio, PRP provided assistance to implement a technical agreement between the Republic of Kosovo and the Republic of Serbia related to the return of cadastral documents removed by the Serbian regime during the conflict and finalization of a draft Law on the Kosovo Property Comparison and Verification Agency (KPCVA) to resolve discrepancies between the returned documents and documents currently maintained in Kosovo's Municipal Cadastral Offices. A working group has been established consisting of the Director of the Legal Office of the Prime Minister's Office, the Kosovo Cadastre Agency (KCA), the Kosovo Property Agency (KPA), a member of the US Embassy, and the European Special Representative to develop the final draft of the legislation. PRP assisted the working group to amend and harmonize the KPCVA draft law with Law No. 04/L-274 on ratification of the international agreement between the Republic of Kosovo and the European Union on the European Union Rule of Law Mission in Kosovo. Additionally, the Office of the Prime Minister has requested PRP to assistance to begin development of by-laws to implement the new KPCVA law as it expects it will be passed in the next two months.

2.1.3 PROJECTION INTRODUCTION EVENT

With the formation of a new government in Kosovo and appointment of a Minister of Justice, the PRP planned an inaugural event to introduce the program, highlight the support of the Ministry of Justice, and

coordination with the CCPR. On March 2, 2015, The PRP facilitated a Property Rights Stakeholder's Meeting at which the USAID Mission Director and Minister of Justice delivered remarks emphasizing the importance of the property rights sector in Kosovo and supporting the establishment of a property rights Sectoral Working Group. The Team Leader of the CCPR made a presentation highlighting the coordination with the MOJ and the PRP. The COP of the PRP made a presentation on coordination among stakeholders and the Policy Development Specialist introduced the objectives of the SWG. The event was widely covered by TV, print and electronic media.

2.2 OBJECTIVE 2: IMPROVED COURT PROCESSES RELATED TO PROPERTY CLAIMS

2.2.1 ASSIST KJC AND STAKEHOLDERS TO IDENTIFY GAPS TO RESOLVE PROPERTY CLAIMS

In January, 2015 the PRP completed a participatory court assessment activity with judges from the Ferizaj, Gjilan, and Gjakova Basic Courts. The assessment shed light on a wide range of issues that constrain efficient resolution of property claims and disputes. A major constraint is outdated cadastral records that do not provide accurate data about ownership, use, or occupancy rights over immovable property in dispute and do not enable courts to determine the history of a land parcel including transactions, sub-division or consolidation. Based on this finding, PRP developed a proposal for USAID direct assistance to municipalities to improve information sharing between municipal agencies and courts providing courts with immediate access to property rights documentation and cadastral maps. Additional findings from the assessment report on issues impacting due process and efficient case handling will inform development of reform activities with the recently established Courts of Merit.

2.2.2 ESTABLISH FOUR COURTS OF MERIT

In collaboration with the Kosovo Judicial Council (KJC), the PRP facilitated a participatory round table on February 12, 2015 with the presiding judges of the seven basic courts, the presiding judge of the court of appeals, and court administrators of Supreme Court to discuss issues raised by the court assessment report and propose a transparent mechanism for selecting four Courts of Merit (COM). The purpose of the COM is to develop, pilot and test procedures and standardized processes to improve judicial performance in the adjudication of property rights claims and disputes. On February 20, 2015, the Director KJC, Director of the KJC Secretariat and the President of the Court of Appeals agreed with the PRP the criteria for selecting the COM.

Selection criteria included:

- Basic Courts located in municipalities with diverse population and higher minority representation;
- Case workload;
- Commitment of the court leadership to support reform;
- Capacities of judges and staff to accept PRP assistance and collaborate with the project to achieve reform;
- Commitment to develop a court action plan that will address steps for improving the adjudication process for property rights claims;

- Agreement of the court to provide PRP full access to court data;
- Agreement to allow judicial and administrative personnel to attend and provide trainings to other court personnel to implement specific reform measures.

The President of the Court of Appeals and the KJC, in consultation with Presidents of the Basic Courts and PRP selected the Basic Courts of Peja, Gjilan, and Ferizaj with the Branch in Sterpce as the COM.

Additionally, the President of the Court of Appeals and Basic Court Presidents highly recommended establishment of an Advisory Committee comprised of thought leaders and agents of change in the court system to assist the KJC and PRP develop procedures and processes to increase court efficiency. The following judges were appointed as members of the Advisory Committee: Judge Hasan Shala ,Court of Appeals; Judge Beshir Islami , Mitrovica Basic Court; Judge Valon Totaj , Prizren Basic Court; Judge Ahmet Idrizaj, Gjakova Basic Court; Judge Rrustem Thaqi , Peja Basic Court; Judge Berat Spahiu , Gjilan Basic Court; Judge Fejzullah Rexhepi, Ferizaj Basic Court; Judge Hasim Sogojeva , Pristina basic Court. It is expected the Advisory Committee will be fully functional in the next quarter.

2.3 OBJECTIVE 3: ENHANCED WOMEN'S RIGHTS TO USE PROPERTY IN PRACTICE

2.3.1 PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO USAID-ENGAGED CSOS TO DEVELOP LOCALLY SENSITIVE FILM/TV CONTENT TO INCREASE PUBLIC AWARENESS ABOUT WOMEN'S PROPERTY RIGHTS AND ADMINISTER AWARDS

In February 2015 the Tetra Tech ARD Director of Grants Management and PRP Grants and Subcontracts Manager assesses capacity of USAID's Engagement for Equity (E4E) implementing partner, Advocacy Training & Resources Center (ATRC), to implement E4E program. The Director of Grants Management provided training of the PRP Grants and Subcontracts Manager and the Communications and Public Outreach Manager and four ATRC staff on USAID grant making procedures, systems, and planning processes that include identification of appropriate technical programming, the types of grants to be issued, engaging CSOs, solicitation and selection of sub-grantees, pre-award, award and implementation (monitoring/reporting/tech support), and accountable grant closeout. PRP assisted ATRC to develop its Grants Management Manual and to prepare its six-month action plan to implement recommendations from USAID's pre-award survey of ATRC to strengthen its organizational capacity. PRP provided ATRC complete documentation to establish Standard Operating Procedures for a Grants Program Information Management System.

Additionally, ATRC was provided assistance to develop topics to issue RFAs for grants that will assist PRP achieve its program objectives related to public education, outreach, and advocacy activities to improve women's access to property rights in practice.

Illustrative grant topics include:

- Legislative development: Activities may include analysis of existing legislation and public consultation of new legislation to inform development of improved legislation and legal reform. In support of these activities grantees may conduct high profile roundtable and other activities to raise awareness about legislative reform.
- Development of Behavior Change Communication (BCC) campaigns: Grantees may implement BCC to change attitudes regarding women's inheritance and/or property ownership rights by

campaigns and other awareness activities, including campaigns conducted through TV media, new media, social networking or print media;

- Monitoring of court and notary practices related to inheritance and other issues constraining women from fully exercising their rights to property;
- Conduct assessments and analysis of legal, procedural and court practices and to identify court practices preventing women from exercising their rights and produce recommendations with concrete actions for relevant institutions to take to remedy the situation;
- Training/Technical Assistance to pro bono legal assistance providers to improve representation of women involved in property/inheritance cases;
- Support for providing legal aid to women including development of methodologies and manuals for CSOs and Municipal Gender Officers to inform women of their legal rights, especially the right to inherit property;
- Raise awareness of women's entrepreneurial groups about the use of property as collateral for business opportunities;
- Provision of support and advice to women entrepreneurs, especially those in the agriculture sector;
- Social research on the constraints faced by women members of minority communities to obtain information about their property rights and to use these rights in practice.

PRP continued to work with key stakeholders to refine its Behavior Change Communications (BCC) strategy and messaging that will serve as a key component in the information and outreach program that the PRP will support ATRC to implement through grants to CSOs under the E4E program. PRP facilitated participatory workshops on January 28 and March 30, 2015 to further develop BCC content and messaging.

Participants at the events included the Advisor to the President of Kosovo, the Agency for Gender Equality of the Office of the Prime Minister, the MOJ, Kosovo Cadastral Agency (KCA), Kosovo Women's Network, ATRC, OSCE, GIZ Land Management and Cadastre Project, and the USAID Partnerships for Development Program and EMPOWER projects. Key findings from the events were that:

- There is the perception that dividing the family land weakens the socio-economic power of the family;
- Traditionally, the cultural norms in Kosovar society are to avoid transferring property to women and sons-in-law and blending family property;
- Women feel good about themselves and take pride when they renounce their rights because they feel they are demonstrating to society that their familial ties are more important to them than material property;
- Women tend not to take their inheritance because they feel by doing so they will bring discontent to their family because taking property is seen as a self-serving act that weakens their family's position in society;
- Renunciation of inheritance by sisters in the family is considered an insurance to return to their parental home, inherited by brothers, in case of divorce;
- Dowry is often seen as a woman's inheritance. Dowry includes movable assets such as gold, clothing, textiles, or other movable property.

PRP will assist ATRC and CSOs to implement BCC activities to change attitudes and behaviors that make families reluctant to discuss inheritance, perpetuates the belief that a woman will receive wealth

though her husband and therefore doesn't need property through inheritance, empower males in the family to drive the conversation about inheritance rights, and to increase knowledge and understanding of women and men about women's rights to inherit property.

Another key outcome from the workshops was the formation of a Property Rights Communications Working Group to coordinate information and outreach activities promoting women's property rights that are currently being implemented by government agencies and donor funded projects.

PRP has issued a subcontract to a local company, UBO Consulting, which has begun to collect baseline data and implement a Knowledge, Attitudes, and Practices (KAP) survey to be used to further refine PRP's communication and outreach support.

2.3.2 CONDUCT AN IN-DEPTH ANALYSIS OF THE LEGISLATIVE GAPS AND PROBLEMS RELATED TO WOMEN'S RIGHTS

The Minister of Justice expressed support for the recommendations presented in the Gender Report Dr. Sandra Joireman prepared for PRP during the last quarter. He requested PRP to facilitate an event jointly with the MOJ to discuss the ministry's support for reform based on the report's recommendations to strengthen the property rights of women. The event is scheduled for April 22, 2015.

Main issues/recommendations from the report include:

• Exclusion of female heirs in inheritance processes/coerced renunciation of rights

Many men and women do not know that women have the right to inherit property. Women and men should be fully informed that women have a legal right to inheritance of property. Women have the rights to renounce an inheritance right to property, but any renunciation of inheritance must be entirely voluntary and without duress.

• Judicial proceedings relating to women's property and inheritance rights need to be handled in a legal, timely, and fair manner

A renunciation of inheritance must be voluntary after full disclosure of the inheritance right, there must be an opportunity of legal representation, full financial disclosure, and documentation in conspicuous, plain language of the financial impact of the renunciation.

• Exclusion of minor children from inheritance

Minor children in Kosovo have insufficient property protections. The Inheritance Law of Kosovo allows for the renunciation of the rights of minor children with no custodial oversight. The rights of minor children, particularly female children, need to be protected, given the cultural norm of exclusion. These are concerns for the minor children of heirs who are excluded from inheritance processes, as well as for children whose parents or guardians are included in the inheritance proceedings, but choose to renounce the rights of their children. Legislation should provide custodial oversight of renunciation cases involving minor children. Any renunciation of inheritance rights of minors should be heard before a court and not a notary to allow for oversight.

• Informal property rights

Families choose not to formalize their property holdings because of culture, expense, or a lack of awareness of the benefits. This can prevent any formal transition of property between

generations upon the death of a property owner. If a family does not engage in any process of formally transferring property from one generation to the next then there will effectively be no recognized heirs which impacts the ability of both male and female heirs to access capital.

• The role of notaries in inheritance processes

Notaries play an important role in Kosovo in uncontested inheritance cases. Currently there is variation in how uncontested inheritance cases are handled in different parts of the country. Legislation should clarify and unify the process for handling uncontested inheritance cases.

• Inconsistencies in law regarding marriages

The Inheritance Law and the Family Law have very different provisions regarding their recognition of 'factual' marriages. The differences have a potentially significant negative impact on surviving 'factual' spouses, male and female, as well as surviving children. Legislation is needed to harmonize the Law on Inheritance and the Family Law and registration of marriages should be incentivized.

2.3.3 IMPROVE LAWS RELATED TO WOMEN'S OWNERSHIP AND INHERITANCE RIGHTS

On Feb 12, 2015, PRP met with the Agency for Gender Equality (AGE) to discuss support to drafting the Administrative Instruction (AI) for Registration of Common Property. A Working Group for drafting this Administrative Instruction was created by the decision of the Deputy Prime Minister. The AI is intended to provide incentives for joint registration of marital property in the name of both spouses. Incentives include waiver of registration fees and reduction of property and transaction taxes. Joint registration will help ensure equal participation of women and men in the property rights as a basic human right guaranteed by the Kosovo Constitution. To mark International Women's Day, on March 9, 2015, PRP with the support of AGE organized an event to launch the initiative for the AI. Stakeholders including the donor community, civil society, CCPR, notaries and others attended the event and were overwhelmingly in favor of the initiative.

After several meetings, the PRP, GIZ Land Management and Cadaster Project in cooperation with the Agency for Gender Equality, drafted an action plan and a timeline on who/how to develop this administrative instruction. The working group met to prepare a first draft of the instruction from 31 March to 5 April 2015. The PRP Policy Development Specialist and the Grants and Subcontracts Manager were members of the working group and provided technical assistance to develop the AI's and content of the draft. The first draft of the AI produced by the working group will be presented in a series of six regional public discussions supported by PRP. It is expected a final draft will be ready for submission to GOK for final approval by September 2015.

On March 18, 2015 PRP's Grants and Subcontracts Manager represented the project on the Family and Inheritance Law working group established by the CCPR project. Thus far, only one roundtable discussion has been organized by the CCPR, entitled "Family Law and Inheritance Law: Problems and Perspectives". A report from the workshop is forthcoming. PRP has also provided CCPR technical recommendation to be included in a draft an analysis of these laws.

Also, the Minister of Justice has created a working group, on which PRP specialists will serve, to recommend amendments to legislation as part of the Ministry's reform efforts

Additionally, PRP initiated coordination activities with NDI and AGE to synchronize activities regarding the public discussion event as part of the Week of Women that will be organized March 23-27, 2015. The PRP lead activities the second day of Women's Week that was dedicated to women's property rights. The PRP COP and MP Lirije Kajtazi, the Chair of the Parliamentary Committee for Human Rights, Gender Equality, and Missing Persons made welcoming remarks and chaired the panel discussions. The event was widely covered by television, print and electronic media, and information was posted on March 24, 2015 to the USAID Facebook page.

2.3.4 PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO CSOS THAT ASSIST WOMEN TO DEVELOP STRONGER BUSINESSES USING PROPERTY AS COLLATERAL

On February 4, 2015, the PRP staff visited the NGO "Widow Women of Korenica", in Gjakova. As one of the beneficiaries of USAID/NOA project, the visit to this NGO was to better understand how property rights impact women's entrepreneurship in the agriculture sector. The head of the NGO was very much interested to expand her business, but does not own the business property. The main obstacle she mentioned are high fees that the process requires. As a widow, whose husband was killed during the war, she cannot afford such a fee. This is one example that reflects the situation of many other vulnerable women. PRP staff also met with the NGOs Active Women in Gjakova, Gjakova Shelter, and Kosovo Women Initiative (KWI) to understand constraints women's business face related to property rights issues. Concerns were expressed regarding the informal economy that is occurring in western Kosovo dominated by women. Women sheltered because of the domestic violence also have property issues, since property belongs to their husbands or brothers.

2.4 OBJECTIVE 4: IMPROVED COMMUNICATION, ACCESS TO INFORMATION AND UNDERSTANDING OF PROPERTY RIGHTS

2.4.1 COORDINATE STAKEHOLDER PROPERTY INFORMATION TO FACILITATE SELECTION OF MUNICIPALITIES TO RECEIVE DIRECT ASSISTANCE FROM USAID

During the past quarter, PRP conducted a series of meetings to help inform development of the proposal for activities to be funded by direct assistance from USAID to municipalities. A brief synopsis of the meetings follows.

On January 13, 2015, PRP met with Mr. Murat Meha, CEO at the Kosovo Cadaster Agency and representatives of the World Bank RECAP Project. The purpose of the meeting was to see in practice the project implementation in Reconstruction of the Cadasters in several Cadastral Zones of Kosovo Municipalities in order to find out methods for simplifying practices and procedures regarding the average of cost, number of parcels and allocated resources.

On January 16, 2014, PRP met with the Deputy Mayor of Lipjan Municipality to learn the details of the reconstruction of four cadastral zones and impacts in that municipality. The Municipal Service Delivery Specialist has analyzed the data and the impact related to the ongoing process implemented by the World Bank RECAP Project for reconstruction of the cadastre in ten municipalities in Kosovo, as well as the data from six reconstructed Cadastral Zones in Lipjan municipality. A preliminary finding is that the average cost for reconstruction is around 34 Euro/ha where inheritance is not an issue.

PRP met with directors for Geodesy, Cadastre and Property departments in Ferizaj, Gjilan, Istog municipalities to review the steps and procedures that should be followed by the municipalities in case of

eventual initiation of reconstruction of the cadastral zones by municipalities. PRP conducted an additional review of number of parcels in Cadstral zones, size, number of potential owners.

PRP met with Mr. Besnik Osmani, General Secretary and Mr. Agron Maxhuni, Head of Legal Department at the Ministry for Local Self-Government to introduce the PRP program, the plans for G2G funding, and emphasize the importance of a partnership with MLGA. Mr. Osmani expressed the Ministries and his personal support to the PRP and highlighted his concern over unregistered municipal owned property. He suggested that a possible activity could be helping municipalities determine the extent of municipal land and assist municipalities register municipal lands.

To clarify certain software issues regarding the suggested G2G activities, PRP met with the resident advisor for Construction and Spatial Planning of the USAID Partnership for Development Project. That project is using a standalone GIS application developed on the Quantum GIS platform to track unpermitted constructions.

On February 26, 2015, the COP and the Policy Development Specialist met the new Team Leader and a Legal Expert of the GIZ Land Management/Cadastre Project. The meeting confirmed that GIZ is not considering activities at the municipal level that would duplicate proposed activities by PRP.

2.4.2 ASSESS POSSIBLE ACTIVITIES FOR THE MUNICIPALITIES SELECTED FOR G2G FUNDING

The Tetra Tech Senior Technical Advisor/Manager was engaged from March 1, 2015 to March 20, 2015 to refine and clarify the objectives of the preliminary SOW presented in the G2G assessment report submitted to USAID last quarter. Building on the findings of the G2G assessment report and the court assessment report produced under Objective 2, a revised proposal for municipal activities to be funded by USAID with direct assistance.

The report proposes to build upon and the further develop the GIS applications developed by the EU funded 'Implementation and Enforcement of Rural Spatial Planning (IRuSP) project. The application was developed in consultation with and has been approved by both the Ministries for Environment and Spatial Planning and Agriculture, Forestry and Rural Development. These applications provide technical solutions to advance PRP objectives, have institutional grounding, are national in scope, and are currently used by every municipality in Kosovo.

In summary, the proposal envisions USAID will provide funding to municipalities to scan and digitize property related documents (contracts, allocation decisions, building permits, maps, etc.) contained in municipal archives. Then, by adding scanning and indexing and related searching functions to the IRuSP applications, municipalities will be able to upload scanned property documents indexed according to parcel number into the already functional GIS application. The application will then enable courts to click on a parcel on the KCA issued parcel map to pull up all scanned documents from the municipal archives related to that parcel.

Additionally, the applications will be modified to include a court-municipality connecting application that will provide courts immediate access to the cadaster map and relevant documents. The application is both simple and inexpensive; requiring that courts only need a desk top computer with 500 GB memory and a large monitor to access data. The applications, including scanned documents linked to cadastral maps, will be stored in the Public Administration Data Center server located in the Ministry for Public Administration as provided for in the Government of Kosovo's "E-government" strategy. The court's

computer will be linked to the module through the government's optical cable connection that links all ministries and municipalities to the Data Center.

PRP will ensure the technical specifications for the scanning, digitizing and indexing of documents that will by contracted by municipalities with USAID funds are fully compatible with the scanned cadastral documents to be returned from Serbia in the near future. This will enable full integration of property documents into Kosovo's cadastral system and provide courts with all available documents linked to Kosovo's cadastral maps to more efficiently resolve property claims.

Also, the proposal also suggests direct assistance to municipalities to tender the services of a licensed survey firm to prepare surveys and required documents for the municipality to formally and finally register its municipal property rights in Kosovo's cadastral system. Once registered, the municipality can then safely invest in the land to promote opportunities for Public Private Partnerships. Opportunities include investment in irrigation or construction of collection facilities.

The proposal was presented to USAID at the end of last quarter and will be discussed further in the next.

2.5 PLANNED FOR NEXT REPORTING PERIOD

Key priorities for the next quarter are to advance development of the National Strategy for Property Rights; develop and implement reform activities through the Courts of Merit; assist ATRC to implement E4E activities in support of PRP efforts to change attitudes and behaviors about women's rights to property and assist the MOJ to develop legislation to strengthen the property rights of women; and work with USAID to further develop the proposal for direct funding to municipalities to improve the sharing of land-related information to assist courts to more efficiently resolve property claims and to facilitate market transactions.

2.6 COMMUNICATIONS AND OUTREACH

On January 28, 2015, the PRP Communications and Public Outreach Manager and the Monitoring and Evaluation Specialist have conducted a workshop with partner organizations to finalize the PRP Behavior Change Communications Strategy that will empower outreach efforts in property rights sector. This is an important step towards ensuring the coordination of current and future activities that derives from the outreach implementation plan.

On February 5, 2015 the Communications and Public Outreach Manager and the Tetra Tech Director of Communications worked on the implementation plan that will lead towards the finalization of the Behavior Change Communications Strategy by incorporating reflections from the workshop with partner organizations conducted last week.

The necessary coordination activities have been made and the Agenda for the Property Rights Stakeholder Meeting has been finalized.

On March 24, 2015 the PRP Communications and Public Outreach Manager met with Mr. Gent Salihu Advisor of Minister of MoJ and Ms. Xheraldina Cernobregu, USAID Development Outreach & Communications Specialist to discuss further details for organizing a joint public event for launching the PRP Gender Report and show the political commitment for addressing issues of women's property rights and inheritance. The event is foreseen to take place on April 22, 2015.

2.7 MONITORING AND EVALUATION

On January 14, 2015 the Monitoring and Evaluation Specialist attended a roundtable organized by Peer Educators Network – PEN, in Kosovo. The workshop was to present and discuss the Manual on Gender Mainstreaming prepared and published by PEN. The manual presents a useful tool for Objective 3 analyze gender issues. The manual also describes the steps needed to make sure that the gender issues are adequately recorded in the M&E systems.

6.0 PROJECT BRIEF UPDATE

The absence of an effective property rights framework in Kosovo weakens democratic governance, impacts human rights, disempowers women and impedes sustainable economic growth. The overall goal of the Property Rights Program (PRP) is to improve the property rights regime in Kosovo, strengthen the rule of law, and increase economic growth and investment. The Property Rights Program is implemented under four objectives:

Objective 1: Better Coordination and Policy Priorities

Objective 2: Improved Court Procedures Related to Property Claims

Objective 3: Enhance Women's Rights to Use Property in Practice

Objective 4: Improved Communication, Access to Information and Understanding of Property Rights

To support development of a National Strategy for Property Rights under Objective 1, PRP provided assistance to the Ministry of Justice (MOJ) to prepare the technical documentation required under the applicable legislation to request a decision from the Government of Kosovo (GOK) authorizing the MOJ to draft the National Strategy for inclusion in the GOK's Strategic Plan for 2015. In parallel, PRP worked with the MOJ, the Department for European Integration and Policy Coordination of the MOJ, the EU Support to the Civil Code and Property Rights Project (CCPR) and USAID to establish the modalities for the Property Rights Sector Working Group SWG), through which the National Strategy will be developed and presented to the GOK. The MOJ submitted the request to the Prime Minister's Strategic Planning Office on March 10, 2015 and approval is pending.

PRP is also working with the MOJ and CCPR to assess property classifications prescribed under the laws of the former Yugoslavia to be updated consistent with the requirements of a land market to support Kosovo's economic development. The issues of restitution, both pre and post-conflict, and challenges regarding resolution of the clams related socially-owned enterprises (SOEs) also constrain development of a robust land market. These are significant issues will be addressed by the SWG through the National Strategy.

Upon request of the Adviser of the Prime Minister without Portfolio, PRP provided assistance to implement a technical agreement between the Republic of Kosovo and the Republic of Serbia related to the return of cadastral documents removed by the Serbian regime during the conflict and finalization of a draft Law on the Kosovo Property Comparison and Verification Agency (KPCVA) to resolve discrepancies between the returned documents and documents currently maintained in Kosovo's Municipal Cadastral Offices. A working group has been established consisting of the Director of the Legal Office of the Prime Minister's Office, the Kosovo Cadastre Agency (KCA), the Kosovo Property Agency (KPA), a member of the US Embassy, and the European Special Representative to develop the

final draft of the legislation. The Office of the Prime Minister has requested PRP to assistance to prepare by-laws to implement the new law as it expects it will be passed in the next two months.

PRP facilitated a participatory process with the Kosovo Judicial Council (KJC) to select four Courts of Merit that will work with the PRP to develop, pilot and test court procedures to more efficiently adjudicate property claims and disputes and ensure women's rights to inherit property are fully enforced. In consultation with the KJC, the presiding judges of the seven basic courts, the presiding judge of the court of appeals, the Basic Courts of Peja, Gjilan, and Ferizaj with the Branch in Sterpce were selected as the Courts of Merits. The President of the Court of Appeals and Court Presidents highly recommended establishment of an Advisory Committee comprised of thought leaders and agents of change in the court system to assist the KJC and PRP develop procedures and processes to increase court efficiency. It is expected the Advisory Committee will be fully functional in the next quarter.

In February 2015 the Tetra Tech ARD Director of Grants Management and PRP Grants and Subcontracts Manager assessed capacity of USAID's Engagement for Equity (E4E) implementing partner, Advocacy Training & Resources Center (ATRC), and provided support to ATRC to begin the process of issuing and administering grants under the E4E program. ATRC was provided training on USAID grant making procedures, systems, and planning processes throughout the entire grants cycle. Additionally, ATRC was provided assistance to develop RFA topics that will assist PRP achieve its program objectives related to public education, outreach, and advocacy activities to improve women's access to property rights in practice.

PRP continued to work with key stakeholders to refine its Behavior Change Communications (BCC) strategy and messaging that will serve as a key component in the information and outreach program that the PRP will support ATRC to implement through grants to CSOs under the E4E program. PRP facilitated participatory workshops on January 28 and March 30, 2015 to further develop BCC content and messaging. Another key outcome from the workshops was the formation of a Property Rights Communications Working Group to coordinate information and outreach activities promoting women's property rights that are currently being implemented by government agencies and donor funded projects.

The Minister of Justice expressed support for the recommendations presented in the Gender Report Dr. Sandra Joireman prepared for PRP during the last quarter. He requested PRP to facilitate an event jointly with the MOJ to present the ministry's support for reform based on the report's recommendations to strengthen the property rights of women. The event is scheduled for April 22, 2015. The Minister has created a working group, on which PRP specialists will serve, to recommend amendments to legislation as part of the Ministry's reform efforts. PRP also worked with CCPR project experts to review legislation and practice regarding family and inheritance law and produce a draft an analysis of these laws.

PRP developed and submitted to USAID a substantially revised proposal for activities to be implemented by municipalities with direct assistance from USAID to improve the sharing of land-related information to assist courts to more efficiently resolve property claims and to facilitate market transactions. USAID will provide comment and feedback to further develop the proposal in the next quarter.

Key priorities for the next quarter are to advance development of the National Strategy for Property Rights; develop and implement reform activities through the Courts of Merit; assist ATRC to implement E4E activities in support of PRP efforts to change attitudes and behaviors about women's rights to property and assist the MOJ to develop legislation to strengthen the property rights of women; and work with USAID to further develop the proposal for direct funding to municipalities to improve the sharing of land-related information to assist courts to more efficiently resolve property claims and to facilitate market transactions.
